

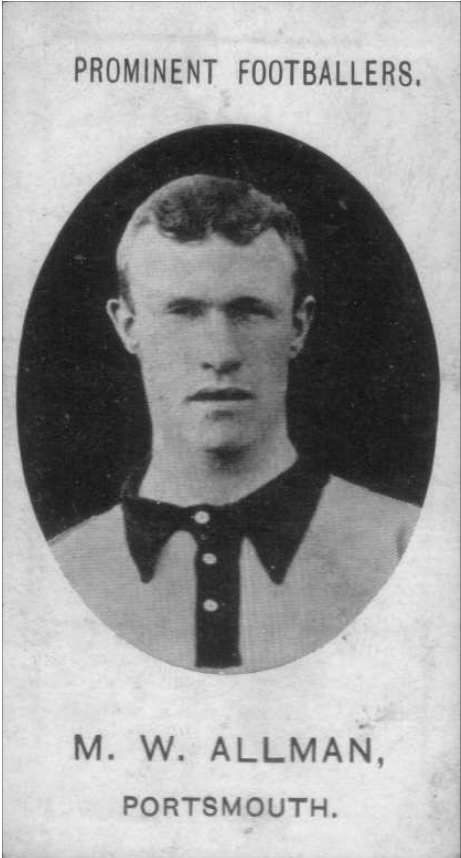
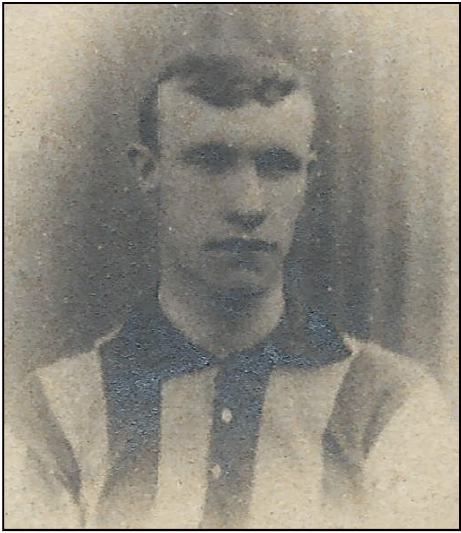

<i>Jottings</i>

The 1891 Census records him as a scholar living at 54 Dale Street, Burslem with his father John, a 45 year old joiner, his mother Sarah (42), a brother Arthur (15) and a sister Hannah (6)

The 1901 Census records him as a 17 year old potter's printer living at 17 Sant Street, Burslem with his parents and sister; with his mother recorded as a dressmaker and his sister as a printer's transferer

The 1911 Census records him as a professional footballer living at 5 Oak Street, Rhondda with his wife Beatrice (24) and son Gilbert (4) - he was with Ton Pentre at the time

Made his debut for Burslem Port Vale in the F.A. Cup against Nantwich on 28.11.1903

Was Burslem Port Vale's leading scorer in 1904-05

Also appeared for Burslem Port Vale in the Birmingham Cup and the Staffordshire Cup

Scored six goals for Reading in what was possibly the club's first match against foreign opposition, a 13-5 win over Parisien Athletique on 20.9.1905

His season at Plymouth saw him win a runners-up medal in the Southern League

Scored the winning goal for Wrexham in a 2-1 win over Chester in the 1910 Welsh Cup final

His appearances (goals) for Wrexham included Birmingham & District League 33(15) and the Welsh Cup 5(4)

Appeared for Croydon Common in 9 minor cup matches, scoring 1 goal

One of six Leicester Fosse players to leave the field early during the notorious weatherbeaten match at Grimsby in January 1912

Never appeared on a winning side in his 7 appearances for Leicester Fosse

Played in Croydon Common's last ever match, scoring the club's final goal

Gained Southern League Division 2 and Southern Football Alliance championship honours with Croydon Common

Enlisted in 1915 and served in France with the Royal Garrison Artillery (No. 193552), winning the Victory and British War medals

On demobilisation from the Army, he joined Crystal Palace as a reserve centre-half and also fulfilled this role at Maidstone

His record of 5 games and 2 goals for Crystal Palace in the grid above is a minimum, as he may have made more appearances

By playing for Crystal Palace at The Nest, he joined Jack Little and Cyril Smith in playing home matches for two separate clubs at the same ground

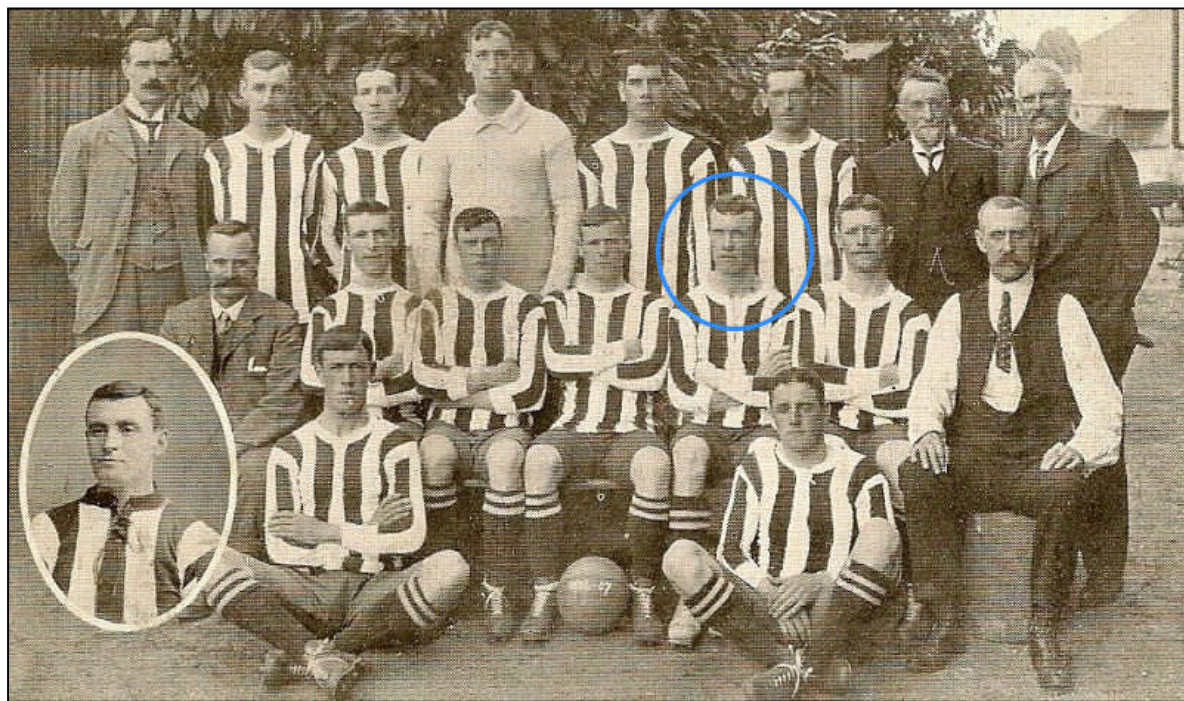

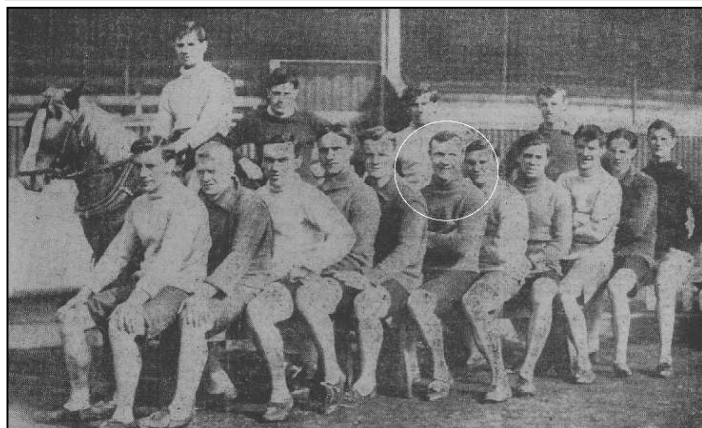
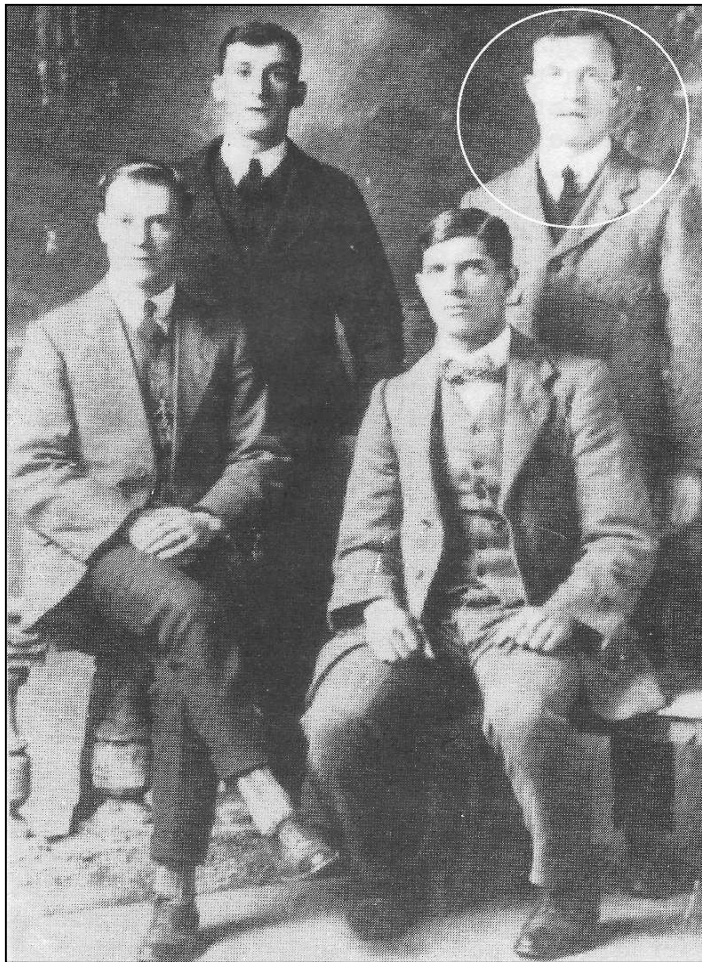
