Jottings

Founder of the professional Croydon Common club

Was Secretary of the amateur and professional Croydon Common clubs for many years; including the period between his two spells as manager

Managed the professional Common club to its first honour - the championship of Southern League Division 2 in 1908-09

His one appearance for the professional Croydon Common club was as stand-in goalkeeper (v. Sittingbourne), but had earlier regularly played in goal for the amateur Robins

Was manager of Croydon Common (cs1907 to 12.1909 and cs1911 to 4.1912), Leicester Fosse (4.1912 to 3.1914) and Swansea Town (5.1914 until the war)

In the 1901 Census, he was recorded as a lather and lath render living at 184 Gloucester Road, Croydon, with his father George (52), also a lath render and a corn merchant, together with his mother Annie (49) and his sisters Annie (26), Emma (25) and Alice (21)

In the 1911 Census, which was taken in between his two spells as Croydon Common manager, he was recorded as a lather and lathrender living at 11 Devonshire Road, Croydon with his wife Carla (32), his new born son George and his sister-in-law Edith Carter (21)

Was the youngest manager in the Football League (34) when he took over as manager at Leicester Fosse

Resigned at Leicester Fosse after the club was fined for making an illegal approach to an Ilford player named BLAKE

Wisely turned down an invitation from the German F.A. to coach in southern Germany shortly before the outbreak of WW1
