<i>Jottings</i>

No first team appearances for Crystal Palace
The 1911 Census records him as a bookkeeper, living as a boarder with his brother Charles (39) at 158 Langdale Road, Thornton Heath, Croydon
Although he occasionally played for Croydon Common during the same period, he was a regular for Nunhead from 1908 to 1911
Won a Surrey Senior Cup medal with Nunhead in 1907-08 and a runners-up medal in the London Senior Cup in 1908-09
Won a runners-up medal in the London Charity Cup with Nunhead in 1908-09; the final was played at Dulwich Hamlet's ground on 26.2.1909 and resulted in a 1-1 draw against London Caledonians (with future Commoner Watson in goal), with the replay being lost 1-0 on 1.5.1909 at Leytonstone
Played for Nunhead against Croydon Common in what was the Robins' first ever F.A. Cup match
Represented London three times while at Nunhead
Represented Surrey while at Dulwich Hamlet and also had an England amateur trial
After two years as vice-captain, he was appointed club captain at Dulwich Hamlet for the 1914-15 season
Missed some Dulwich Hamlet matches in 1914 as he was drilling with the City of London Police as a Special Constable and a programme in 1915 refers to him as P.C. Clegg
Was later a member of the Dulwich Hamlet management committee and a 1934 programme records that he was the club's Surrey F.A. Council representative
Was also Dulwich Hamlet's Honorary Secretary until he was taken ill at the end of 1941
Played local amateur cricket for Beulah Cricket Club and also appeared for the Dulwich Hamlet cricket side
