Made no first team appearances for Queens Park Rangers
Appeared in 2 minor cup matches for Croydon Common without scoring
The 1891 Census records him living in Old Road, Alderbury with his parents and seven siblings
The 1901 Census records him as a mason's labourer living in Old Harnham Road, East Harnham, Salisbury with his parents and four siblings
The 1911 Census records him as an assurance agent living at 11 Old Street, East Harnham, Salisbury with his father and three of his siblings
Was an excellent cricketer who had success as a bowler and batsman in the Salisbury & District League
Married Alice Massey in 1914 and they had a daughter Olive in 1916
After three years as a territorial, he joined the Coldstream Guards as Private 21210 and was killed in France
Is buried in Fampoux British Cemetery in France
His name is on the memorial boards at St. Martin's Church in Milford and All Saints Church in East Harnham
