The longest serving Robin; from the amateur days until the final professional season - and a shareholder as well!

The 1901 Census records him as a general labourer living at 7 Devonshire Road with this widowed mother, Elizabeth, a charwoman and his brothers Robert (22) and Fred (15); his father having died in 1886

Was captain of the amateur Croydon Common side that won the Croydon Charity Cup in 1903

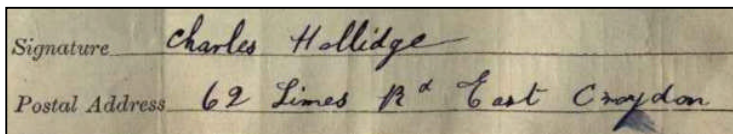
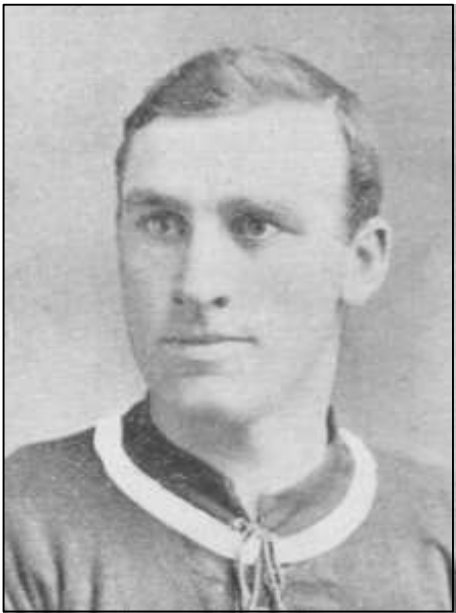
Was selected as trainer and reserve player when a London Select team visited France to play two games; (i) v. a Paris Select eleven on 1.11.1913 (won 5-0) and (ii) v. Cercle Athletique de Paris on 2.11.1913

Appeared for Croydon Common in 1915-16, while the club's assistant trainer, in a 3-0 defeat at Watford on 11.12.1915, as only eight players had travelled, with manager JOHN BOWMAN and trainer DAVE GARDNER making up the numbers

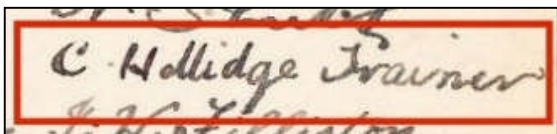
The 1911 Census records him as a general labourer living at 62 Limes Road, Croydon with his wife Fanny (32) and his children Charles (5), Edith (4), Frederick (2) and Doris (9 months)

Was a various times the assistant trainer and groundsman at the Common and in 1920 became trainer at Charlton Athletic

Married Fanny Elizabeth Dyball and they were living at 397 Sydenham Road, Croydon when they died within a year of each other
